

OPEN AIR BURN PERMIT INSTRUCTIONS

NOTE: BURN PERMIT APPROVAL REQUIRES 2 BUSINESS DAYS NOTICE

Open air burning within the Municipality of Lambton Shores is regulated by By-law No.60-2009. It is up to the permit holder to ensure that he/she has read, understood and adheres to the restrictions and regulations contained in the by-law.

General Instructions

1. Permit applications are available at any of the three Lambton Shores municipal offices. (Hours of Operation: Mon – Fri, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). Completed permit applications must be delivered in person to the Lambton Shores Forest Office a MINIMUM of two business days prior to the date of the proposed burn. **NOTE: THE PERMIT IS GOOD ONLY FOR THE DATES SPECIFIED** in the application form.
2. If a permit is granted, it is a requirement that the property owner or his designate have their copy of the permit available at all times for possible inspection by fire personnel.
3. If the fire department is dispatched or attends for any reason, and it is determined that the fire's size has exceeded that allowed by the permit, or any of the other conditions of the permit have been contravened, the Municipality will revoke the permit, extinguish the fire, and a full-cost recovery fine will be levied as per Sections 8.3 and 12 of By-law 60-2009.

REQUIREMENTS:

1. The owner of the property is responsible for adhering to the requirement and conditions of the permit, and the Lambton Shores Open Air Burning By-Law No. 60-2009.
2. Two (2) piles maximum may be burned at any time – maximum size 10m X 10m, unless prior approval from the Fire Chief for a larger size.
3. Burning is limited to the specific area and material approved in the permit.
4. An open air fire is to be limited to daylight hours.
5. Weather and wind conditions must be favourable in order to have an open air fire.
6. The open air fire shall be supervised by a competent adult equipped with sufficient equipment to control and contain the open air fire to prevent the spread of the open air fire that would endanger or put at risk other properties or premises.
7. No burning of waste material, construction material, treated wood, or petroleum products, i.e. roofing materials, tires, railroad ties, etc. is allowed.
8. Open air fires that create an annoyance or irritation to adjacent persons, properties or premises shall be extinguished.
9. The bearer of this permit shall be solely liable for any or all damages resulting from the open air burn and will further be responsible for making full-cost restitution to the Municipality of Lambton Shores for services rendered with respect to manpower and equipment attending, extinguishing and placing apparatus in service for any contraventions of the Lambton Shores Open Air Burning By-law.
11. The owner of the property must give permission to contractor or tenant to burn on their property. Failure to provide this permission invalidates this permit and places the legal responsibility for all damages directly on the permit holder, applicant or tenant.
