



The *Phragmites* Adaptive Management Framework (PAMF) combines participatory science and adaptive management into a collective learning process, producing annual data-driven guidance for participants managing non-native *Phragmites*

2021/22 CYCLE SUMMARY

33 *Phragmites* managers with 113 management units are enrolled in PAMF

Over **213** acres
(86 hectares) enrolled

An average management unit
is **1.9** acres (0.8 hectares)

95 management units
received data-driven guidance



PAMF provides guidance as a series of optimal and near-optimal **management combinations**, which may change each year as our predictive model learns from new participant's data that is incorporated annually



There are **16 possible management combinations**, comprised of **three management actions**—one for each phase of the *Phragmites* life cycle (translocating, dormant, and growing)

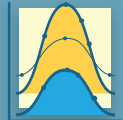
